

Japanese Knotweed

There have been a number of reports about the growth and spread of Japanese Knotweed in Redlands over the last year. It is a non-native, invasive species of plant introduced in the mid-nineteenth century as an ornamental garden plant.

This plant has the potential to damage footpaths and even the foundations of houses if not dealt with. Land owners are not legally obliged to remove Japanese Knotweed, unless it is causing a nuisance to neighbouring property. However, the



Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 does make it an offence to plant, or cause Japanese Knotweed to grow in the wild.

Redland's Councillors have been working on lots of issues around the ward, including:

- ✓ Taking a resident parking scheme through committee for **Warwick Road** and **Cintra Avenue**.
- ✓ Sorting out communal bin areas in Hadrians Walk
- Arranging for the height of the pavement on Addington Road by the bus stop to be adjusted so passengers can use the accessible buses.
- ✓ Getting the benches repaired on Redlands Road.
- ✓ Working with residents to resist building in gardens in a conservation area.
- ✓ Working with the council on preventing fly-tipping on Hexham estate.
